System 1: MS Word

1. Install app
2. Get plugin for Word
3. Create library (using, e.g., Google Scholar)
4. Cite within Word using plugin

System 2: L^AT_EX

1. Create library using text editor: .bib file
2. Choose package and cite within L^AT_EX
Alternatively, use app (e.g., BibDesk)

Pros and cons

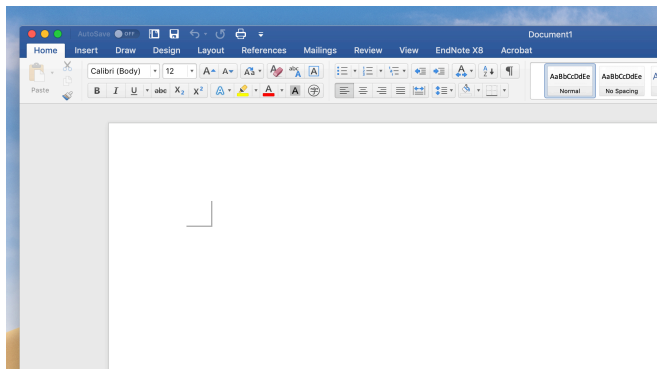
Similar to L^AT_EX vs. Word:

- ▶ Word: more user-friendly, but less control
- ▶ T_EX: less user-friendly, but more control
